Karen exemplifies and personifies the Golden Hammer Award. Karen's first "boots-on-the-ground" volunteer connection with MATE was in 2010 as pastor of Bedford Presbyterian Church. She brought the teens in BPC's confirmation class to MATE to paint and repair, starting a tradition at the church. Karen retired in 2019, but that first team of youth and their advisors expanded to a larger intergenerational team which still comes to MATE every summer. Teens on that first work team learned about serving others and leadership, and some return as adults to volunteer, to this day.

Karen expanded her work with MATE as President of the Board, working with Executive Director Thea Kornelius to change from a church-led organization to a non-profit 501(c)3 with new requirements, a new governance structure and funding challenges. Then COVID hit, and MATE had volunteer challenges to meet. Karen and Thea wrote extensively, gaining funding through new grants, and championing new ideas for serving those in need of better housing. New marketing and outreach efforts launched and new board members and volunteer groups joined. Karen stepped in to provide leadership and support through it all.

Karen is no longer on the MATE Board of Directors but still involved, still volunteering, still a MATE champion. Most recently, Karen has led formation of the Builders' Team program, connecting with donors and encouraging recurring monthly donations to ensure MATE's future sustainability and predictable cash flow. Through her long-time and committed work, Karen focuses on the needs of the housing insecure and underserved. MATE is grateful for all Karen has done and is doing!
